Cambridge Autonomous Metro

Work on the Cambridge Autonomous Metro has been ceased, pending a decision to be taken at the Combined Authority Board in October 2021. Work continues on the regeneration of March Station complex and Whittlesea and Manea car parking solutions. The Combined Authority continues to be committed to public realm enhancements at these locations. King's Dyke Level Crossing

The CPCA has committed £14.2m of capital funding to support the implementation of each the approved Masterplans for St Neots, St Ives, Huntingdon, Ramsey, Wisbech, March, Chatteris, Whittlesey, Ely, Soham and Littleport.

Market Town Masterplans

The Combined Authority has funded | Construction on Phase 1 started in this transport hub for the onnectivity of the people of Sohan and the surrounding area, to directly access new opportunities. The station is on track to open in December 2021.

March 2021 and is on schedule for practical completion in July 2022. The planning application for Phase project progresses as programmed.

The Combined Authority remains committed to a transport solution, connecting Wisbech to the wider area, with a link direct to March. Officers 2 was approved in June 2021, and are collaborating with Network Rail, to review the final business case, prior to a delivery decision.
