Since the start of Workstage 3 in January 2022, the OPA Project Team have been reviewing the masterplan, in consultation with the Embankment Masterplan Project Team, to consider the feasibility of integrating the arena as part of the overall development of the Embankment. As part of this process, several options on possible locations were developed to test this opportunity. These options have been presented to Propco and collectively reviewed against the constraints and opportunities this would present for the University project. This review process has considered several aspects including:  • Quantum: The impact the arena would have on the ability to deliver the quantum of space required to support the growth and expansion of the University over the long-term
