Progress

- Operational plan developed to meet upon the targets set by CEC, ensuring alignment to local CPCA priorities.
 This allows for focused termly activities to take place
- Working group established and bid development commenced in anticipation of SPF
- Recruitment campaign launched for Enterprise Advisors
- Data deep dive on all schools to allow for effective, targeted support
- £30k secured to deliver STEM careers interventions in Fenland
- Subject Matter Leads and resource creation/identification underway
- Continued development of Talent Portal to house information and resources for Careers Leaders
- Careers Leaders meetings established on a termly basis, stand alone SEND group
- Bi-monthly newsletter developed to streamline communications and support to Careers Leaders
